#### Piano Cleveland Executive Board Meeting Monday May 12, 2025 at 5:00 pm 20600 Chagrin Boulevard, Shaker Heights, OH 44122

Linda McDonald called the meeting to order at 5:03. Zeda Blau moved to pass the Consent Agenda and Robin Baum seconded it. Motion passed unanimously.

We welcomed Yaron back as he gave the staff report. There will be two concerts tomorrow with Daniela Liebman. There will be a noon concert at CMA and Cleveland Live in the evening at BrewDog. He realized that he had met Daniela in Mexico when he was on a jury for Young Artists and she was only 7 years old.

Our first prize winner will be recording with Steinway and then have a reception at the Chinese Consulate. Afterwards he will be performing in Cleveland with Chamberfest. Both Yaron and Marissa met with Shark and Minnow. Yaron will be giving a Master Class for the Finland Youth Academy. This should open a new market for Piano Cleveland.

Marissa reminded us about the concert in the Flats which will be partially a four hands piano. She announced sadly that former longtime Board Member Pat Gaskins has passed away and that there will be a Celebration of Life next Tuesday at Severance Hall at 6:00 for supporter and Board Member Clara Rankin.

Rick Stuhan and Stephen Gariepy are the new co-chairs for the Governance Committee. Rick said they will be looking for new members for the board and will bring their nominees to the full board for approval.

Cindy Resch shared that the Investment subCommittee of the Finance Committee met on April 30 with good discussions. Their minutes are included in today's agenda. They reviewed statements from the Gala and noted that the DOGE cuts to federal spending have not affected Piano Cleveland yet though some other local arts organizations have had grants cut.

We received a letter from Ideastream requesting we write to our congressional representatives on their behalf. Their grants are in danger of being eliminated as are most of NPR and Endowment for the Arts grants. Ideastream has been a most valuable and avid supporter of Piano Cleveland. Can we as a 501C3 organization advocate for Ideastream without jeopardizing our tax exempt classification? Attorneys on our board were questioned, and felt unanimously that we should not respond as an organization, but individual writing could be ok depending on wording. A letter was read from attorney and past Board President Jill Clark as a proposed note that could be sent out the board. It has been decided that we are encouraged to reach out individually in support of Ideastream to our Representatives and

Senators however if you choose to address this issue please do not mention your and Piano Cleveland's connection. This is a national issue and we are an international organization. We bring the world's best pianists and their supporters to Cleveland for our competitions. They contribute to our local economy and shine a most favorable light on the United States of America.

Kathy Coleman reported that plans for the Gala with The Five Browns have been moving along. The caterer, florist, tablecloths and mailings have all come in under budget. It was decided not to always go back to the same vendors we have used in the past. Iris Harvie has been included in decisions. Co-chair Eric Barbato thanked Kathy for her counseling as party planning has not been his expertise yet.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:08.
