Making Music Accessible For All



With 5+ partners in the Cleveland Metropolitan School District and surrounding neighborhoods, our interactive and fun school-based programming reaches hundreds of young music lovers grades K-8 each year, at no cost to our partners.

All of our programs get kids up and moving through dance, eurhythmics, and participatory music-making. Three current programs include:



Students choose a work of literature and write a song inspired by their chosen narrative using provided keyboards.



Students clap, sing, and dance along as they embark on a musical journey guided by a narrator reading a popular children's book.



Students build critical listening skills by being exposed to piano music of the highest artistry and are encouraged to interpret the music in their own ways.



ONLINEVIRTUAL PIANOKIDS

Featuring Caption Joe and Admiral Emily, these short videos take viewers ages 3-8 around the world to learn musical building blocks. Topics include rhythm, meter, dynamic, pitch, and more!





AFTERSCHOOL PIANOLAB

Launched in January 2023, PianoLab offers free after-school group keyboard instruction using a state-of-the-art keyboard lab to K-8 students at Paul Dunbar Elementary, a CMSD school. Over 30 students have registered since spring 2023.

Together, we offer an inclusive keyboard skills and musicianship course for current TMS adult students, held at their University Circle campus





CLEVELAND SCHOOL OF THE ARTS

An annual arts collaboration for music, dance, and visual arts students, culminating in performances for CMSD students and a public performance for Cleveland audiences. Programs have included Carnival of the Animals, and Alex and the Monsters.



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT



PIANO AND KEYBOARD DONATION PROGRAM

Re-homing pianos to those in need, whether they are students wishing to begin their piano journey or community spaces where live music is otherwise inaccessible. 22 pianos have been placed around Northeast Ohio, as well as 22 digital keyboards.



SENIOR CONCERTS

Community artists perform free monthly concerts across 4 senior living facilities.









PIANOKIDS AT CIPC



Students from community partners like the Boys and Girls Club spend the day watching a competition performance, and participating in a variety of activities such as eurhythmics, a drum circle, and an interactive seminar. Lunch and snacks are provided.
