#### sideNotes: Grand ideas for Cleveland

According to Gustaw Alivia, founder and director of the Alivia Argorich Foundation in The Hague, there are now close to 1,000 plano competitions in the workf. They all aim to froster and support young talent and offer a variety of awards and opport runties. But how true is thick How much do they really help young artists to prepare for life as a masician or to learn how to interact with audiences? And what tools do they give musicians to make an impact on society?

The Cinvelland International Plano Competition, celebrating its 50th seniversary this year under the sligger. The Future is Garand, has tried to answer these questions by offering a number of innovative and diverse ideas. Participants were not only playing "against," each other, they were asked to also perform tagether in a proctacular "Grand Plano Playoff". Here, the 16 competitors performed in pairs, playing new arrangements of pop songs well known to the audience.

Looking back at the 2024 Cleveland competition, many of the new features have worked well. Of course, few competitions can show off with an orchestra as spectacular as the Cleveland Orchestra, and the four finalists made for a truly exciting last round (Zilian Wei, 25, won First Prize with a lively Rachinaninoff No. 31. But the competition's efforts to attract and engage new audiences, to prevent young artists in new and attractive settings, and to expand the boundaries of the traditional plano competition repertoire, have definitely paid off and earned praise not only from the locals, but also from the 80 delegates of the 2024 Conference of the Alink-Argerich Foundation, who visited Develand during the final week of the competition. Representatives from piano competitions in 20 countries around the world discussed a variety of topics related to their competitions, trying to share creative ideas and offer innovative solutions.

"Currents in music have completely changed in the past 50 years, and competitions need to reflect those changes", says Knhibong. "I wouldn't say that the traditional competition structure doesn't serve them, but there is certainly norm for improvement."

Many of those ideas could already be experienced firsthand in Cleveland, proving that its 2004 competition has already made a "grand" strip towards the future.
