Linda McDonald called the meeting to order at 5:08. The Consent Agenda was passed as corrected.

Marissa explained that Yaron is traveling home from Capetown, a 30 hour trip. He had a stop in Zurich to arrange possible connections for Piano Cleveland. She then turned the meeting over to Ryan Ireland to explain to the board what the marketing department has been doing so far and plans to continue spreading Piano Cleveland's name and positive reputation.

Ryan explained the process used in choosing Shark and Minnow as our marketing firm. Ryan, Chris and Marissa met with several firms and they were the clear choice. He further discussed the science involved in designing advertisements, events and script to be effective and how to measure their success. A slide show broke down the process as he spoke. The presentation will be emailed to the board following the meeting for review.

Cindy Resch gave a finance report in Robin's absence on this day before tax filing. Our audit is starting in April and the Investment Committee is scheduled to meet tomorrow.

Ce Sinclair has resigned from the Governance Committee and Jill Clark has agreed to join the committee. Alec Pendleton moved and Kathy Coleman seconded the nomination of Jill to be on the Governance Committee. The motion passed unanimously. There are now seven members on the committee.

Chris announced that Piano Days was very successful raising \$14,300. Kathy Coleman and Eric Barbato reported about the Gala Brunch to be held on July 20. They have met with four florists and the caterer Spice requesting prices from all as they are hoping to keep the costs low. We can accept 450 people total and 272 have already committed due to sponsor tables. Sponsors need to commit by May 2 to be included in printed advertising.

Marissa reminded everyone about the two concerts this week. One will be at noon at CIM and the other the following day at the Hofbrauhaus at 6:00.

Under New Business we wished Good Health to Kathy Coleman, Paul Sequeira and Richard Schwarz who have all been recovering.

Piano Cleveland Education and Community Engagement Updates June 9, 2025 - Board of Directors meeting

The Education and Community Engagement Committee convened on April 16 for their second quarterly meeting. At the meeting, the committee focused largely on the evaluation rubrics that are being created to evaluate programs according to the strategic plan. Observations and suggestions from the committee included adding a flexible weighting system, the need for clearer observer guidelines and consistency, and adding demographic details and examples. Another draft of the rubrics will be presented at the next committee meeting in July. Additional program updates followed, including a successful Arts Alive production; possible expansion of its PianoLab program; requested grant funding from the Nord Family Foundation for a new program called Keys Unlocked, designed for the Cleveland Metropolitan School District; and updates from our in-school education programs.

Two additional highlights for the Board include:

PianoLab

The PianoLab programs continue to grow and deliver meaningful musical experiences for our students. We recently held two successful showcases, where students performed pieces they've been learning in front of friends, family, and peers. The event at Paul L. Dunbar was particularly well-attended, drawing nearly 100 guests—a strong testament to the program's community engagement and impact.

Building on this momentum, we are exploring the launch of a third PianoLab within the Cleveland Metropolitan School District, aiming to expand access and opportunities for more students to connect with the piano.

Piano and Keyboard Donation Program

The donation program continues to thrive and remains a valued resource within the community. To date, we have successfully donated 37 pianos and 38 keyboards to individuals, schools, and organizations in need. The positive impact of the program is becoming even more visible—several recipients will be showcasing their talents at the Community Showcase during this summer's Festival on Monday, July 28, providing a wonderful opportunity to see the program's influence in action.
